STAGGERING STATS

- Mental Health is the first leading cause of Years Lived with Disability (22.9%)
- Financial burden of mental disorder globally will be \$6 trillion by 2030
- Lost economic output 16.3 trillion (2011-2030)
- 800,000 people die due to suicide every year

NEPAL NUMBERS (2)

- 1 in 3 people are suffering from mental health problems
- Govt spending less than 1% of its health care budget
- 0.22 psychiatrists and 0.06 psychologists per a population of 100,000
- Over 90 percent mentally ill have no access to treatment

3 POLICY PERSPECTIVE

- WHO MENTAL HEALTH ACTION PLAN 2013-20
- MENTAL HEALTH POLICY drafted in 1996 but not yet endorsed in Nepal
- Mental health one of key interventions under Output 3 (equitable distribution and utilization of health services) in National Health Sector Strategy 2015–2030 of Nepal
- No separate body under Ministry of Health

POLICY GROUP SUGGESTIONS

- Allocation of more budget at least 5 percent of total healthcare budget
- Advocacy through mass media
- Decentralization of services to peripheral level
- Create a government body responsible for overlooking all mental health issues
- National level prevalence survey of mental health
- Integration of mental health as a basic health service

6 COMMUNITY GROUP SUGGESTIONS

- Raise awareness at community level informing people mental illness as not a consequence of past sins/taboos but a health related problem
- Encourage family members to take proper care and not ignore/discriminate them
- Patient friendly services and proper counselling
- Coordinate with CSOs/NGOs/INGOS/Pressure groups
- Inclusion of mental health issues in school curriculum
